<p>Imagine you are a superhero who can fly. Write a description or poem of what you can see and where you go.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you show your route on a map?</p>	<p>Make a model of something that can fly (Your model doesn't have to fly).</p> <p>This is a good homework for the February half term holiday!</p> <p>Challenge: Can you add labels or a diagram to explain what each part is?</p>	<p>Draw and label a picture / model / animation of the solar system.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you make a rhyme to remember the order of the planets?</p>
<p>Write an information (non-fiction) report about how Hot air balloons fly. You'll have to do some research first, then write your report about the information you found out.</p>	<p>Find things in your home that create or use forces (e.g. the door handle needs pushing and pulling to work)</p> <p>Draw diagrams to show the forces used at home.</p>	<p>Plan your dream day. Where will you go? What will you do?</p> <p>Show/draw an analogue clock to show what time you would do each activity.</p> <p>Challenge: Write the digital 24 hour time for each clock.</p>
<p>Plan a route from Wales to Australia. List (or draw) the countries you would fly over and their capital cities.</p>	<p>Create a homework project of your own choice! It must be clearly presented and must show some careful work!</p> <p>Challenge: Can you create something linked to one of our lessons?</p>	<p>Design or make a times tables game to play with someone at home to help people learn their tables.</p> <p>Challenge: Ask someone to test you on your tables.</p>
