What have been our successes since the last report to parents?

We can look back on another successful year here at Llandrillo. At the beginning of the year we set ourselves targets for improvements and we have seen progress.

Implementation of writing strategies We have successfully implemented assertive mentoring and results have improved in every year group.

Improve standards in Welsh oracy

Welsh is improving throughout the school and there has been a 50% increase in pupils using the Welsh language around the school.

Developing the recording of evidence using ICT All teachers have a mini I pad which they use to record, plan and take photos for evidence.

Develop reasoning and procedural maths skills throughout the school.

We are extremely pleased with our maths results, 100% have moved up 2 levels or more from KS1 to KS2.

Implement new assessment strategies to further track pupils progress throughout the school.

We have introduced assertive mentoring and pupils are making progress in all year groups. In Year 6 98% improved in procedural and 85% improved in reasoning skills.

Ensure coverage of the science curriculum. A discrete scheme of work has been produced to ensure the development of science skills.

School's Opportunity for Sport

The governors are asked to report on the provision made by the school for pupils to participate in sport.

In addition to the 2 x weekly PE sessions for all classes, this year, pupils have taken part in the following local competitions: Conwy cross country, Conwy Athletics, Conwy Rugby Festival, Conwy Cricket Festival.
